

## **Providing innovative e-learning on-the-job-training solutions for Kenyan nurses**

Working in partnership with the African Medical and Research Foundation (AMREF) and the Nursing Council of Kenya, Accenture launched a revolutionary e-learning initiative developed by Accenture Learning and funded by the Accenture Foundations. E-learning will rapidly train and certify 20,000 Kenyan nurses over a five year period, instead of 100 years. It is the first time large-scale, nationwide, computer-based, self-paced learning has been used by medical professionals in Africa.

The growth in the number of registered nurses will increase the capability of frontline healthcare workers in treating Kenya's most debilitating diseases, such as HIV/AIDS, TB, malaria and nutrition, as well as at administering preventative treatment in the nation's remote and impoverished areas through community health.
